B. PROOF OF PUBLICATION

D. ADDITIONS OR DELETIONS TO THE AGENDA

There were no additions or deletions to the agenda.

E. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. September 5, 2024, Regular Board Meeting

The September 5, 2024, Regular Board Meeting minutes were presented.

A **motion** was then made by Commissioner Heard, with a second from Mr. Whiting, to approve the minutes as amended. The **motion** carried **4-0**.

F. OLD BUSINESS

There were no old business items to come before the board.

G. NEW BUSINESS

1. Consider Selection of Professional for Surveying Services

Mr. Stokus stated that Commissioner Marino would like to present for this agenda item and Mr. Karmeris informed the Board that Mr. Higgins was not present and has not had a chance to review this item as he was in an accident.

There was a **motion** by Commissioner Heard, seconded by Mr. Cutting, to move this item to the next meeting's agenda. That **motion** passed 4-0.

2. Consider Resolution No. 2024-06 – Adopting a Fiscal Year 2023/2024 Amended Budget

Mr. Karmeris presented the amended budget and explained the process to the Board.

There was a motion by Commissioner Heard, seconded by Mr. Whiting approving Resolution No. 2024-06 – Adopting a Fiscal Year 2023/2024 Amended Budget. That **motion** passed **4-0**.

H. STATUS REPORT

1. Legal – Status Report

Ms. Holmes addressed the request from the Board on whether the District has an obligation to repair washouts that occur on district owned property. Ms. Holmes stated that the short answer is yes so long as the benefit is not for one or two property owners only. A determination would have to be made on whether the repair would serve a public purpose or just to one or two property owners. It would need to be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Mr. Cutting asked if the District was obliged to protect those private properties from misuse in any way such as notifications, signage, etc. Ms. Holmes stated that the district was not obligated.

Ms. Holmes also mentioned that the deadline for the 4-hour ethics training requirement is December 31st.

2. Engineer – Status Report

There was no engineer report today.

3. District Manager – Status Report

There was no report today.

4. Field Maintenance – Status Report

Mr. Mansell went over the photos he presented to the Board and discussed a few washouts. He also discussed the aftermath of the hurricanes that went through the area. He stated that he has been doing a lot of cutting and tree trimming out in the area. Commissioner Heard asked if it was quiet out there now that everything is so wet. Mr. Mansell said he hasn't seen many people, but it is hunting season now. Mr. Cutting asked how the general wear and tear on the canal is. Mr. Mansell said just some washouts. Mr. Cutting asked what he does with debris once he cuts it, Mr. Mansell said he just gets it off the pathways but does not haul it off.

5. Security – Status Report

Mr. Hudson was not present today but will be at the January meeting to present his report.

I. AUDITOR SELECTION COMMITTEE

Mr. Karmeris presented staff's rationale and recommendation to select the current auditor Grau and Associates.

A **motion** was then made by Commissioner Heard, with a second from Mr. Whiting, adopting staff's rankings with Grau and Associates as the top ranked respondent. The **motion** carried **4-0**.

A **motion** was then made by Commissioner Heard, with a second from Mr. Cutting, to select Grau and Associates as the auditor for Fiscal Years 2024, 2025, 2026 with an option for two additional years. The **motion** carried **4-0**.

J. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

a. Financial Report

Mr. Karmeris pointed out the financial report in the Board book. There was no action required.

b. Consider Invoices

Mr. Karmeris presented the invoices in the book. The invoices were then approved, as presented, on a **motion** made by Commissioner Heard, seconded by Mr. Whiting, and the **motion** carried **4-0**.

There were no landowner items.

L. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

There were no comments from the public.

M. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Commissioner Heard informed the Board of a settlement Martin County is close to approving that involves some land in PalMar WCD. The Board asked that staff contact John Maehl to give a presentation for the next PalMar WCD meeting.

Mr. Cutting mentioned a realtor's ad that he came across suggesting mitigation for development being allowed for land within PalMar WCD. A brief discussion ensued on the counties' wetland mitigation allowances.

RESOLUTION NO. 2025-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE PAL-MAR WATER CONTROL DISTRICT ESTABLISHING A COMMITTEE TO REVIEW RESPONSES RECEIVED FOR THE SURVEYING SERVICES REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, PAL-MAR WATER CONTROL DISTRICT ("PMWCD") is an independent special district of the State of the Florida, initially created by Circuit Court Decree as the Rotunda Drainage District in 1968 in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 298, Florida Statutes, and as amended by Court Order in 1972, changing the name to Pal-Mar Water Control District, as further amended and supplemented by Chapter 82-356, Laws of Florida, Chapter 85-483, Laws of Florida, and Chapter 2005-307, Laws of Florida.

WHEREAS, the PMWCD Engineer is authorized to, among other things, make all necessary surveys of the lands within the boundary lines of the district in order to prepare reports, maps and profiles for the PMWCD Board of Supervisors and update the water control plan as necessary pursuant to Chapter 298, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, to effectuate the PMWCD Engineer's responsibility to make all necessary surveys of district lands, on October 1, 2024, the PMWCD issued a Request for Qualifications for Surveying Services to assist and/or perform said survey work ("RFQ"); and

WHEREAS, by the deadline of October 23, 2024, the PMWCD's District Manager received submittals to the RFQ; and

WHEREAS, PMWCD and its Engineer wish to establish a committee to review responses and provide recommendations to the PMWCD Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, PMWCD is further authorized and empowered by Chapter 287, Florida Statutes, to establish a committee to review responses to the PMWCD's RFQ; and

WHEREAS, the committee members shall be chosen by the PMWCD Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, for its review and recommendations to the PMWCD Board of Supervisors, the committee shall follow the terms of the RFQ and its Competitive Selection Criteria, attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE PAL-MAR WATER CONTROL DISTRICT:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing "Whereas" clause is hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution.

Section 2. Approval. The Board of Supervisors of the Pal-Mar Water Control District (the "Board") hereby establishes a committee to review responses to the RFQ surveying services and provide recommendations to the Board and the next scheduled regular meeting of the PMWCD.

<u>Section 3.</u> Severability. REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS FOR SURVEYING SERVICES FOR THE PAL-MAR WATER CONTROL DISTRICT

RFQ for Engineering Services

The Pal-Mar Water Control District ("**District**"), located in Pam Beach and Martin County, Florida, announces that professional surveying services will be required on a for the District's services for Boundary/Right-of-Way Surveys along the constructed canals that lie within the District boundary in Martin and Palm Beach Counties authorized by Chapter 298, *Florida Statutes*. The surveying firm selected will act in the general capacity of District Engineer and will provide District surveying services, as required.

Any firm or individual ("Applicant") desiring to provide professional surveying services to the District must: 1) hold applicable federal, state and local licenses; 2) be authorized to do business in Florida in accordance with Florida law; and 3) furnish a statement ("Qualification Statement") of its qualifications and past experience with pertinent supporting data. Applicants must submit information relating to: a) the ability and adequacy of the Applicant's professional personnel; b) whether the Applicant is a certified minority business enterprise; c) the Applicant's willingness to meet time and budget requirements; d) the Applicant's past experience and performance, including but not limited to past experience working for a District Engineer for any water control district or community development district and past experience with Martin and Palm Beach; e) the geographic location of the Applicant's headquarters and offices; f) the current and projected workloads of the Applicant; and g) the volume of work previously awarded to the Applicant by the District. Further, each Applicant must identify the specific individual affiliated with the Applicant who would be handling District communications.

The District will review all Applicants and will comply with Florida law, including the Consultant's Competitive Negotiations Act, Chapter 287, *Florida Statutes* ("CCNA"). All Applicants interested must submit one (1) electronic copy on a flash drive of the **Qualification Statement 5:00 p.m. on October 23, 2024,** to the attention of Andrew Karmeris, Special District Services, Inc., The Oaks Center, 2501A Burns Road, Palm Beach Gardens, Florida 33410 ("**District Manager's Office**").

The Board shall select and rank the Applicants using the requirements set forth in the CCNA and the evaluation criteria on file with the District Manager, and the highest ranked Applicant will be requested to enter into contract negotiations. If an agreement cannot be reached between the District and the highest ranked Applicant, negotiations will cease and begin with the next highest ranked Applicant, and if these negotiations are unsuccessful, will continue to the third highest ranked Applicant.

The District reserves the right to reject any and all Qualification Statements. Additionally, there is no express or implied obligation for the District to reimburse Applicants for any expenses associated with the preparation and submittal of the Qualification Statements in response to this request.

Any protest regarding the terms of this Notice, or the evaluation criteria on file with the District Manager, must be filed in writing, within seventy-two (72) hours (excluding weekends) after the publication of this Notice. The formal protest setting forth with particularity the facts and law upon which the protest is based shall be filed within seven (7) calendar days after the initial notice of protest was filed. Failure to timely file a notice of protest or failure to timely file a formal written protest shall constitute a waiver of any right to object or protest with respect to aforesaid Notice or evaluation criteria provisions. Any person who files a notice of protest shall provide to the District, simultaneous with the filing of the notice, a protest bond with a responsible surety to be approved by the District and in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

The scope of services (the "Scope") and associated fees shall be as follows:

- 1. Boundary / Right of Way Surveys (SC-01)
- Prepare Boundary/Right -of -Way Surveys along the constructed canals as shown in blue on Exhibit "A" (Included) as defined in Chapter 5J17-05 of the Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.).
- Preform title/deed research of the district's records to determine the right-of-way locations.

| Avenue, Okeechobee, Florida 34974. |

WHEREAS, the PMWCD is an independent special district of the State of Florida and operates according to the provisions of Chapter 2005-307, Laws of Florida, as amended, and applicable provisions of Chapter 298 of Florida Statutes and other Laws of Florida (together herein referred to as the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the PMWCD desires professional services to perform security patrols of its Works of the District ("Works") and provide reports of observations in order to protect the Works pursuant to the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, the PMWCD and Independent Contractor for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and understandings contained herein, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged, do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. **Duties of Independent Contractor**: The Independent Contractor shall provide patrol services of the PMWCD Works, as identified on Exhibit A, and provide monthly reports to the PMWCD in writing to S.Brown@SDSinc.org and oral reports to the PMWCD board at the regular board meetings consisting of reports of observed damage to the Works, identify of person(s) causing or contributing to the damage.
- 2. **Status as an Independent Contractor:** Nothing in this Agreement shall create or be construed as creating a partnership or joint venture between the PMWCD and the Independent Contractor. Independent Contractor does not have the power or authority to bind the PMWCD in any promise, contract or representation other than as specifically provided for in this Agreement (if any).
- 3. **Compensation:** PMWCD agrees to pay Independent Contractor \$120.00 per hour with a four hour minimum per week, not to exceed 20 hours per week, as compensation for the performance of the duties of the Independent Contractor under this Contract. This compensation shall be paid in monthly installments upon the PMWCD's receipt and approval of an invoice for services.
 - a. Travel time, mileage and costs will not be compensated.

- b. Invoices shall specify the work performed and the time spent on such work and any other information required under this Agreement or as requested by the PMWCD board. Invoices will be paid within thirty (30) days following the PMWCD's receipt of the invoice.
 - c. Payments will be made to Independent Contractor at the address below.
- 4. **Basic Understanding of the Parties:** The parties acknowledge and agree that the PMWCD is a local government with a specialized single purpose of providing drainage, protection and maintenance of its Works. All of the work of the PMWCD is subject to public records, government-in-the-sunshine and related requirements as more fully explained below. The parties understand that because the PMWCD is a local government, certain requirements and limitations apply that would not apply to a private entity.

5. Term and Termination:

- a. This Agreement shall become effective upon approval by the PMWCD and execution by the parties and shall continue until terminated in accordance with this Agreement.
 - b. This Agreement may be terminated with or without cause at any time by either party upon sixty (30) days prior written notice, delivered by both email to Independent Contractor at DILLANHUDSON32@Yahoo.com or to PMWCD at S.Brown@SDSinc.org and by certified U.S. mail, return receipt requested, to the addresses indicated below, in which event all rights, duties and obligations of the parties hereto shall terminate forthwith.

6. Other Related Provisions and Requirements:

- a. Work shall be performed professionally in accordance with generally accepted standards of the trade or business.
- b. Independent Contractor shall provide evidence of general liability insurance and property damage insurance naming the PMWCD as insured; and Workmen's Compensation insurance; and shall indemnify the PMWCD for any of its wrongdoing of the should the PMWCD be made a party to any litigation as to that wrongdoing.
- c. Independent Contractor shall reimburse the PMWCD for damages by Independent Contractor to the Works, personal and/or real property owned by the PMWCD due to negligence of the Independent Contractor.
- d. Independent Contractor is not considered an employee of the PMWCD and is responsible for payment of any and all applicable taxes.
- e. Any controversies that cannot be resolved by the parties shall be subject either to arbitration or mediation as the parties may agree and, if they cannot agree, then mediation. If mediation fails, then legal action may be instituted, and any prevailing party shall be entitled to be reimbursed for all court costs and reasonable attorney's fees incident to such legal action.
 - f. Independent Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the PMWCD for any injury,

loss or damage to person or property, including attorney fees and other costs, when caused by the Independent Contractor's own negligence or arising out of a material breach by the Independent Contractor of this Agreement.

- g. Independent Contractor shall not assign, delegate or otherwise transfer its rights and obligations as set forth in this Agreement without prior written consent of the PMWCD.
 - h. This Agreement may be amended only with the written approval of the parties hereto.

7. State of Florida Requirements:

- **a. Public Records.** Independent Contractor agrees to comply with Florida Statutes regarding public records and specifically agrees to:
- 1) Keep and maintain public records required by the PMWCD in order to perform the service.
- 2) Upon request from the PMWCD, provide the PMWCD with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided for by Florida Statutes.
- 3) Ensure that public records that are confidential or exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of this Agreement and following completion of this Agreement if the Contractor does not transfer the records to the PMWCD.
- 4) Upon termination of this Agreement, Contractor shall transfer, at no cost to the PMWCD, all public records in possession of the Contractor and destroy any duplicate public records if any. Contractor shall transfer the public records in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the PMWCD.

IF THE CONTRACTOR HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO CONTRACTOR'S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT, PLEASE CONTACT THE PMWCD's District Manager, Stephanie Brown (772) 345-5119; 10807 SW Tradition Square, Port St. Lucie, FL 34987; or sbrown@SDSinc.org

b. E-Verify. A public agency or a contractor or subcontractor thereof may not enter into a contract unless each party to the contract registers with and uses the E-Verify system. Sec. 448.095 (5)(a), Florida Statutes.

Pursuant to Section 448.095(5), Florida Statutes, the CONTRACTOR shall:

- 1) Register with and use the E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all newly hired employees and require all subcontractors (providing services or receiving funding under this Agreement) to register with and use the E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all the subcontractors' newly hired employees;
- 2) Secure an affidavit from all subcontractors (providing services or receiving funding under this Agreement) stating that the subcontractor does not employ, Agreement with, or subcontract with an "unauthorized alien";
- 3) Maintain copies of all subcontractor affidavits for the duration of this Agreement and provide the same to the PMWCD upon request;
- 4) Comply fully, and ensure all of its subcontractors comply fully, with Section 448.095, Florida Statutes:
- 5) Be aware that a violation of Section 448.09, Florida Statutes (Unauthorized aliens; employment prohibited) shall be grounds for termination of this Agreement; and,

c. Scrutinized Company Certification.

- 1) The Contractor certifies that it and its subcontractors are not on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List and are not engaged in the boycott of Israel. Pursuant to section 287.135, Florida Statutes, the PMWCD may immediately terminate this Agreement at its sole option if the Firm or any of its subcontractors are found to have submitted a false certification; or if the Contractor or any of its subcontractors, are placed on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List or is engaged in the boycott of Israel during the term of this Agreement.
- 2) If this Agreement is for one million dollars or more, the Contractor certifies that it and its subcontractors are also not on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List, Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List, or engaged in business operations in Cuba or Syria as identified in Section 287.135, Florida Statutes. Pursuant to Section 287.135, the PMWCD may immediately terminate this Agreement at its sole option if the Contractor, or any of its subcontractors are found to have submitted a false certification; or if the Contractor or any of its subcontractors are placed on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List, or Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List, or are or have been engaged with business operations in Cuba or Syria during the term of this Agreement.
- 3) The Contractor agrees to observe the above requirements for applicable subcontracts entered into for the performance of work under this Agreement.
- 4) The Contractor agrees that the certifications in this section shall be effective and relied upon by the PMWCD for the term of this Agreement, including any and all renewals.

- 5) The Contractor agrees that if it or any of its subcontractors' status changes in regards to any certification herein, the Contractor shall immediately notify the PMWCD of the same.
- 6) As provided in Subsection 287.135(8), Florida Statutes, if federal law ceases to authorize the above-stated contracting prohibitions then they shall become inoperative.

d. Human Trafficking Affidavit

The undersigned, on behalf of the Independent Contractor (the "Nongovernmental Entity" as described in Section 787.06(13) Florida Statutes), hereby represents that he or she has read and agrees to comply with the foregoing. Additionally, the Independent Contractor attests under penalty of perjury as follows:

- 1. The Independent Contractor does not use coercion for labor or services, as such italicized terms are defined in Section 787.06, Florida Statutes, as may be amended from time to time.
- 2. If, at any time in the future, the Independent Contractor uses coercion for labor or services, it will immediately notify the PMWCD, and no contracts may be executed, renewed, or extended between the parties.
- 3. I understand that I am swearing or affirming under oath the truthfulness of the claims made in this affidavit and that the punishment for knowingly making a false statement includes fines and/or imprisonment.
- 4. The Affiant is authorized to execute this Affidavit on behalf of the Contractor.

OTHER SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS:

- Officers consistently encounter juveniles operating ATVs without helmets unsupervised
- Several illegal camping on PWMD managed lands.
- While investigating where gunfire was coming from the officer found the subject safely firing his weapon with a proper backstop. While talking to the subject, the subject notified the officer that his RV had been struck by a bullet that was not from him. The officer verified the RV had been struck by a bullet. The subject who had been checked by the officer thanked him for ensuring he was safely firing his firearm, because if someone had been inside his RV when it was shot, they would've been hit.
- Officers encountered several subjects discharging firearms without proper back stops and educated the subjects on proper backstops and the repercussions if their bullet strikes someone else. The discharge was on PWMD managed canals inside of Hungryland WMA being fired towards private property. WMA violations were issued.
- Illegal bonfire on Martin County Property. Fire was put out and party dispersed.
- Numerous fishing license checks with no violations.
- Dog hunters hunting without written landowner permission in possession. Cited accordingly.
- Officers made contact with two individuals discharging weapons on levee along Palmar water district canal. The individuals had targets set up along the levee and were target shooting with 5 pistols, 2 rifles, and one shotgun. A check of the firearms indicated that one of the firearms

was stolen. This was confirmed by my dispatch and the firearm was seized as found recovered property and turned over to the Martin County Sheriff's Office for further investigation. FWC25ON0008093

Summary: Most of the public's reaction to FWC officers out there have been positive and welcoming to the continued work. We have not had any repeat offenders for violations and officers continue to use educational approaches.
